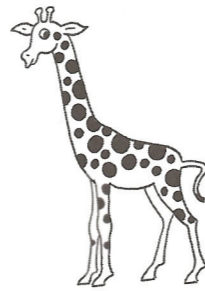

Listen while your teacher reads the following passage.



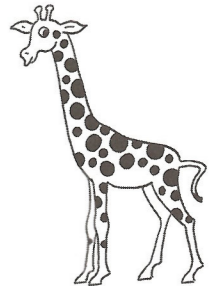
Where do butterflies come from? Well, first of all a female butterfly lays some eggs. Butterflies all have their own favourite plants on which they like to lay their eggs. You can guess that Cabbage White butterflies like to lay their eggs on cabbages. Other butterflies like different plants. The Painted Lady butterfly likes to lay her eggs on sunflower leaves and the Red Admiral butterfly likes nettles best. The eggs are fixed on to a leaf with a special sort of glue.

In spring or summer the eggs hatch into caterpillars. As soon as the caterpillar comes out of the egg it starts eating the leaves on the plant. Then the caterpillar stops eating and begins to turn itself into a chrysalis or pupa. The chrysalis looks like a curled-up dead leaf. Inside the chrysalis the caterpillar begins to turn into a butterfly. When it is ready the butterfly comes out of the chrysalis and spreads its beautiful wings.
